# How to approach the war in Ukraine from a Global Education perspective -

### Resources for teachers and educators

GENE has started to collect a small list of educational resources that might be useful in enabling the difficult conversations to happen around the war in Ukraine, to assist teachers, educators and young people to be able to discuss, process, analyse and critically engage with what is happening in Europe today.

These include resources that help build knowledge about the context in Ukraine and critically reflect on the multiple and global dimensions of war. It also includes resources that explore war and conflict, delve into peacebuilding, human rights, multilateralism, and also the rights of refugees and asylum seekers, tolerance and anti-discrimination. To explore the complexity of the issues connected with the war in Ukraine, educators may also benefit from using resources that help strengthen critical thinking skills, the capacity to engage with controversial issues, to analyse complexity as well as tools to develop critical literacy skills to challenge misinformation, among others.
